Dr. Dow is a pediatrician specialized in infectious diseases who has conducted pediatric HIV clinical research focused on prevention of mother-to-child transmission and improving HIV outcomes among youth living with HIV in Moshi, Tanzania. Dr. Dow has a Master of Science degree in Global Health and was a Fogarty Global Health Fellow 2014-2015. Her skillsets include both quantitative and qualitative methodologic expertise. She is currently funded through a NIH Fogarty K01 (International Research Scientist Development Award) to evaluate the impact of an enhanced HIV curriculum and intensive mental health intervention, *Sauti ya Vijana (The Voice of Youth)*, to improve mental health, antiretroviral adherence, and virologic outcomes among youth living with HIV in Tanzania. Dr. Dow is cosite leader of the Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Centre-Duke University collaboration, a member of the Adolescent HIV Prevention and Treatment Implementation Science Alliance (AHISA), and co-chair of IMPAACT Study 2016, a multi-country, group-based intervention to improve mental health and ART adherence in HIV-infected adolescents in low resource settings.
