## Rosenthal, Jennifer

Dr. Jennifer Rosenthal is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the University of California (UC) Davis. She completed her medical degree at UC Davis and her pediatric residency training at the University of Washington / Seattle Children's Hospital. She subsequently completed a Pediatric Hospital Medicine Fellowship at UC San Francisco. On joining the UC Davis faculty, she was selected to be a Mentored Clinical Research Training Program scholar. As a scholar, she obtained her MAS degree in Clinical Research.

Her clinical practice as a Pediatric Hospitalist and her experience serving on hospital-wide patient safety leadership committees inspired her to work towards reengineering systems for transferring pediatric patients between hospital facilities. Dr. Rosenthal's research includes examining handoffs and communication during transitions of care. She has experience with large database research and qualitative research. Her current projects include: developing and validating a quality metric to capture potentially avoidable transfers from claims data; using qualitative methods to identify determinants of successful implementation of telemedicine for pediatric transfers. Her research has been funded by an American Academy of Pediatrics Community Access to Child Health grant, a Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health young investigator award, and currently an NIH/NCATS KL2 mentored career development award.
