Dr. Solan is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Pediatric Hospital Medicine at the University of Rochester Golisano Children's Hospital. She is a graduate of the University of Notre Dame (BS) and State University of New York at Buffalo School of Medical and Biomedical Sciences (MD). She completed pediatric residency training, chief residency and a three year Pediatric Hospital Medicine fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center (CCHMC). She was also a National Research Service Award fellow at CCHMC and received her Masters in Medical Education through the University of Cincinnati in 2014.

Dr. Solan has a broad interest in improving the way providers communicate with each other and with families as well as improving the support provided to patients as they transition home after hospital discharge. Some of Dr. Solan's previous research activities include serving as a site co-investigator for the IIPE-PRIS Accelerating Safe Signouts (I-PASS) study in Cincinnati and collaborating on a Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute grant awarded to CCHMC which evaluated the experiences of families transitioning home after a child's hospitalization, modified a nurse-led transitional home visit program, and evaluated the efficacy of the new transitional home visit program on patient-centered outcomes. Dr. Solan's current research focus as a funded KL2 Scholar through the University of Rochester CTSI is to evaluate the utility of an existing electronic health record (EHR)-embedded adult risk assessment tool for use in children and to identify additional medical complexity, sociodemographic, and systems-level factors that may contribute to a pediatric patient's risk of unplanned reutilization (i.e., readmission or Emergency Department revisit).
