Indi Trehan, MD, MPH, DTM&H, is an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at Washington University in St. Louis and the Medical Director of Lao Friends Hospital for Children in Luang Prabang, Lao PDR. He received his MD and MPH from Northwestern University and then completed his pediatrics residency at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. He trained in clinical tropical medicine at Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia in Lima, Perú, followed by dual fellowship training in pediatric infectious diseases and pediatric emergency medicine at Washington University.

With a primary interest in tropical medicine and the improvement of clinical care in resource-limited settings, he has spent most of his academic career studying childhood undernutrition through large randomized clinical trials and longitudinal cohort studies in rural Malawi. Working with an outstanding group of collaborators, mentors, and students, he has published more than 70 papers for journals including *The New England Journal of Medicine*, *Science*, *Nature*, *BMJ*, *PNAS*, *The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*. He currently serves as an Associate Editor for *Journal of Tropical Pediatrics* and *BMC Pediatrics*. In his new position in Laos, he spends most of his time providing patient care and training future leaders in pediatrics for southeast Asia, while continuing policy work and research in chronic and acute malnutrition, beriberi, and thalassemia. He serves on the Nutrition Guideline Development Group for the World Health Organization as an advisor to UNICEF, Action Contre La Faim, and the Clinical and Operational Research Alliance based in West Africa.
