

## **Schumacher, Daniel**

Daniel Schumacher, MD, MEd, is an assistant professor in the division of Emergency Medicine at Cincinnati Children's. He has published and lectured widely on milestones and competency-based medical education and was a member of the Pediatrics Milestone Project Working Group. A former associate program director and director of competency-based assessment for one of the premier pediatric residencies in the country, Dan brings practical experience to his current research-focused roles. The bulk of his current research focuses in three main areas. First, he is conducting a series of studies as part of a PhD program that seek to understand the association between entrustment decisions and indicators of quality care. Second, he is the co-PI for a national study of the general pediatrics entrustable professional activities that have been developed by the American Board of Pediatrics. Finally, he recently completed data collection as the PI for a national study looking at how clinical competency committees (CCC) function and make decisions as well as the association between milestone assignments made by CCC members and program directors and recommended advancement decisions these individuals also make.

Dr. Schumacher has been a Visiting Scholar of the American Board of Pediatrics and the American Board of Medical Specialties. He has been part of national and international efforts of the American Board of Pediatrics, Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, Association of American Medical Colleges, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons in Canada, Association for Medical Education in Europe, Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation, National Board of Medical Examiners, Federation of Pediatric Organizations, American Academy of Pediatrics, Association of Pediatric Program Directors, and Academic Pediatric Association.
