Dr. Davis is originally from Michigan, where she attended the University of Michigan as part of the Inteflex combined undergraduate and medical school program, earning her B.S. in Microbiology in 2001 followed by her M.D. in 2005. She completed her Pediatrics Residency at the University of California San Francisco (UCSF) in 2008 and served as Pediatric Chief Resident from 2008-2009. She worked as a Pediatric Critical Care Transport Physician and Hospitalist at UCSF for one year then went on to do a fellowship in Neonatology as part of the Harvard Neonatal Perinatal Medicine Program at Boston Children's Hospital (2010-2013). During fellowship, Dr. Davis earned a Masters in Medical Science (MMSc) through the Scholars in Clinical Science Program at Harvard Medical School, graduating in 2013.
