Colleen Hughes Driscoll, M.D. is a practicing neonatologist at the University of Maryland Children's Hospital. She received medical degree at SUNY Upstate Medical University. She completed a pediatric residency training program at University of Maryland Medical Center in 2008. In 2011, she completed Perinatal-Neonatal fellowship training at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. In 2013, she received training in Health Care Delivery Improvement from Intermountain Institute for Healthcare Leadership Advanced Training Program.

Dr. Driscoll's involvement in research spans several areas of interest including adoption of new technology in the healthcare setting, treatment of complicated abdominal infections, prenatal counseling, and prenatal exposure to indomethacin.

As the Director of Quality Improvement for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, she leads quality improvement projects to improve patient care and communication surrounding patient care. She teaches trainees in NeonatalPerinatal Medicine on quality improvement methodologies and has mentored several trainee-led quality improvement projects. In 2015, she led the development of a wireless text messaging system to improve communication for neonatal resuscitation, winning the 2016 Intelligent Health Association Grand Award and the Award for Improving Patient Care and Health Delivery.
