Stacy Kahn, is an Attending Gastroenterologist at Boston Children's Hospital and an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School. She went to New York University School of Medicine and completed her pediatric residency and pediatric gastroenterology fellowship at the University of Chicago. While at the University of Chicago Stacy also completed an ethics fellowship at the Maclean Center for Clinical Medical Ethics.

Clinically, Dr. Kahn's interests have focused on the care of children with IBD, in particular she is interested in the care and management of teens and young adults with Crohn's and colitis. Stacy's other primary clinical focus is recurrent and refractory Clostridium difficile infection (CDI). She is a national expert and leader in the field of fecal microbiota transplantation (FMT) and performed the first colonoscopic FMT in a child with recurrent CDI.

Stacy's research interests include FMT for Clostridium difficile, FMT for inflammatory bowel disease, transition of care and self-management in IBD and research ethics. She is the director of the FMT research program at Boston Children's Hospital and led the development of the first national pediatric FMT registry.
