Dr. Danica Liberman, MD MPH, is a practicing attending physician in the Division of Emergency and Transport Medicine at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. In the Division, she serves as the Director for Patient Advocacy for the last 8 years. She is assistant professor of pediatrics at the Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California. Her research foci include health services research, population health, palliative care, and cost-effectiveness research, with multiple publications in Pediatrics and other high-impact journals. She has been the recipient of the Lucille Packard Young Investigators grant. Within the academic setting, she works closely with health economists in the School of Public Policy at USC and health policy researchers at the Gehr Family Center for Health Systems Science at USC. She is the co-founder and lead Professor of two pre-health undergraduate USC courses taught on site at the children's hospital focusing on pediatric clinical research and addressing social determinants of health, respectively, which have graduated multiple students into medical school and other fields within healthcare, enhanced the research productivity of the Division, and assisted numerous families in identifying and connecting to the community resources they need.
