



## **Litt, Jonathan**

Jonathan S Litt, MD, MPH, ScD is a practicing Neonatologist and health services researcher at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Director of the NICU Growth and Developmental Support Program at Boston Children's Hospital, and Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School. He holds an MD from Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Litt completed residency training in Pediatrics at the University of California, San Francisco and subspecialty fellowship training in Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital. He is also a graduate of the Harvard Pediatric Health Services Research Fellowship program, an intensive mentored training program through which he pursued an MPH and then a doctoral degree in social science research methods at the Harvard TH Chan School of Public Health. His fellowship and dissertation work centered on the impact on early intervention programs for low birth weight infants on functional outcomes at school age. His body of research is focused on the long-term health and neurodevelopmental outcomes of high-risk infants and evaluating the utilization and effectiveness of community-based intervention services. As an early career investigator, Dr. Litt has published several studies relating to learning disabilities and academic achievement among low birth weight children and adolescents, care coordination for children with special health care needs, and the effect of early intervention programs on school-age functional outcomes. Currently, Dr. Litt is studying the interrelated longitudinal trajectories of respiratory health and neurodevelopment among infants with chronic lung disease, work supported by an NICHD K23 mentored career development award. He is also a founding member of the New England Follow-up Network, a first-of-its-kind regional quality improvement collaborative for high-risk infant follow-up programs.
