Christian Rosas-Salazar, MD, MPH is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics and a member of the Center for Asthma Research at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. He is a physician scientist deeply committed to identifying and better understanding early-life risk factors for the development of childhood respiratory diseases, with the purpose of designing primary prevention strategies for these conditions. His current research focuses on examining the role of the infant respiratory microbiome in the origins of childhood asthma and the programming of the immune response. Dr. Rosas-Salazar obtained his medical degree from the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara. He then completed a residency in pediatrics at Children's Hospital of Michigan and a fellowship in pediatric pulmonology at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC. He is also a graduate of the Master of Public Health Program and the Career Education and Enhancement of Health Care Research Diversity Program of the University of Pittsburgh. His research contributions have been recognized by honors from the American Thoracic Society, the American College of Chest Physicians, the Delta Omega Honorary Society in Public Health, and the Parker B. Francis Fellowship Program, among others.
