Dr. Adam Schickedanz is a general pediatrician and health services researcher and Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA. Dr. Schickedanz's work focuses on social determinants of child and lifecourse health, the health implications of childhood adversity within and across generations, and the impact of clinical and community programs to reduce poverty and parent financial stress as a means to improve parent and child health. Dr. Schickedanz was born and raised in Boston, attended Washington University in St. Louis as an undergraduate, and received his medical training at UCSF (medical school, residency, and chief residency). Dr. Schickedanz spent a year on staff at the National Academy of Medicine (formerly the Institute of Medicine) with its Board on Health Care Services and he was a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar at UCLA. Dr. Schickedanz completed his doctorate in health policy and management at the UCLA Fielding School of Public Health. He lives in Southern California with his wife, Heather, and daughter, Aria.
