What is SPR?



HISTORY

 1929: SPR originated because of discontentment among young investigators - referred to as "Young Turks" - who felt the existing pediatric societies were dominated by very senior faculty

MISSION

• To create a multi-disciplinary network of diverse researchers to improve child health

MEMBERSHIP (Active)

- Honorary society
- Membership is by current Member nomination and Council review
- Eligible Members have a record of current, independent research related to child health




- Established in 2012
- Fellowship through first 6 years as faculty
- Free no cost for junior membership
- "Rolling Admissions" by self-nomination
- Leadership: Fellows
- Junior members receive SPR communications, are invited to SPR events and may serve on SPR committees as approved by Council

SPR Active Member

- Individual engaged in ongoing, independent, hypothesis-driven research related to pediatrics
- Track record of independent work initiated since fellowship (original science manuscripts)
- Typically hold a faculty appointment at the mid/late assistant or early associate level or higher
- Annual dues \$350 (includes subscription to Pediatric Research)
- No age restrictions!



Lila Nolan is a fellow in the Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine program at the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. Her research interests involve the study of the cellular and molecular mechanisms involved in the pathogenesis of necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC). She joined laboratory of Dr. Misty Good upon starting her fellowship and currently studies the mechanisms by which dietary aryl hydrocarbon receptor (AhR) ligands mediate protection against intestinal inflammation using a murine model of NEC. This investigation introduces a novel therapeutic for infants with NEC and will advance the current understanding of NEC pathogenesis. As an officer of the SPR Junior Section, she aims to provide junior members with education and support to foster successful careers as physician-scientists.

The Society for Pediatric Research Junior Section introduces fellows and early career faculty members to SPR by providing a variety of resources and educational opportunities. The goal is to promote networking within pediatrics and continue the development of scientists, as well as to foster transition to a career in pediatric science and eligibility for SPR <u>Active Member</u> status.

Junior membership nomination is open to fellows who are currently enrolled in an academic fellowship or postdoctoral program related to pediatrics or child health, as well as early career faculty in their first six years after fellowship.

Eligibility:

Currently enrolled in or not more than 6 years graduated from established fellowship program related to pediatrics in an academic institution.

Any incomplete applications will be deleted after 6 months from initial application date.

- · Opportunities for participation in regional/national SPR programs.
- Recognition through awards program and travel grants.
- Opportunities to advocate for child health research funding.

The Junior Section is led by a President and a President-Elect who are currently in a fellowship program. Together, they work with the SPR leadership to manage and enhance the Junior Section. The call for President-Elect applications occurs each July.
