Oishei Children's Hospital

In November 2017, Kaleida Health officially opened its \$270 million John R. Oishei Children's Hospital. Oishei Children's Hospital is the regional center for comprehensive and state-of-the-art pediatric trauma, surgical and medical care, including neonatal, perinatal, and obstetrical services. As one of only 43 freestanding children's hospitals in the nation – and the only freestanding children's acute care hospital in New York State – the entire facility was built with children and families in mind. The 12-floor 185- bed modern facility is an integral part of the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus, linking to Buffalo General Medical Center, Gates Vascular Institute, the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at the University at Buffalo, Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center and more. Oishei serves as the only access point for pediatric critical care, Level IV neonatal intensive care, and pediatric trauma care in and for Western New York.

As a world-renowned research university, UB plays a vital role in Buffalo's resurgence as a thriving city that is a magnet for talented professionals, artists, entrepreneurs, and innovators who recognize the tremendous energy and momentum gathering here. While this region is large enough to offer plenty to a diverse population of 1 million residents, it brims over with small-town warmth and friendliness.
