The Division of Pulmonology and Sleep Medicine within the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health is recruiting a Pediatric Sleep Medicine Physician. Candidates with a track record of clinical excellence and academic contributions as demonstrated through training or practice experience are encouraged to apply.

The division provides family-centered, community-based, culturally competent, coordinated, and interdisciplinary care. The multidisciplinary team consists of 10 faculty, a clinical team of nurses, respiratory therapists, dietitians, physical and occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, social workers, behavioral psychologists, and research coordinators. It has a robust outpatient pediatric sleep program and sleep laboratory in which to perform polysomnography and treat children with a variety of sleep-related problems. The division also has active clinical and research programs in a number of other areas including cystic fibrosis, neuromuscular respiratory disease, aero digestive issues, and pulmonary hypertension.

The successful candidate must hold an MD, DO, or equivalent and have completed an ACGME-approved pediatric residency program and an accredited fellowship program in Pediatric Sleep Medicine. Completion of an accredited fellowship program in Pediatric Pulmonology and experience in an academic medical setting is preferred.
