Tell Your Representatives to Protect Medicaid

We are reaching out with a time-sensitive advocacy opportunity for you to reach out to your representatives to reject funding cuts to Medicaid in the House budget resolution. We need you to take action today.

Congress is currently negotiating a federal budget resolution, and Medicaid and CHIP are at risk of facing major cuts. Following the Senate's passage of a budget resolution last week, the House will vote on the federal budget resolution as soon as this week. The resolution under consideration would lead to sweeping cuts to Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). Significant funding cuts could have devastating impacts for the millions of children and families who rely on these programs for health care coverage.

Today, advocates are joining together for a day of action to elevate the vital importance of Medicaid to child health.

That's where we need your help. It is critical that lawmakers hear from academic pediatricians about how Medicaid and CHIP are lifeline programs for children and families in their state and why any funding cuts would harm child health.

Please email or call your U.S. Representative as soon as possible and ask them to <u>vote no</u> on the budget resolution and protect Medicaid and CHIP.

Contact Your Representative Today

Here's how:

<u>Important note</u>: To make your message as powerful as possible, we strongly encourage you to customize your outreach and explain why Medicaid and CHIP are so vital to the patients you care for. Here are some ways to do that effectively:

- Share a short, deidentified patient story or example that illustrates how Medicaid has allowed a
 patient to access the care they need.
- Incorporate a key data point or two on Medicaid and CHIP that is specific to your state you can
 refer to these <u>2025 Medicaid fact sheets</u>.
- Elaborate on the important pediatric research you conduct and the negative impact of Medicaid and CHIP cuts on the ability of academic pediatric departments to continue supporting research.
- Share briefly how specific populations of children that you care for rely on Medicaid such as those with complex health care needs or those in foster care.
