



# All of Us Pediatrics

December 2025 Update

**What we do:** The *All of Us* Research Program aims to accelerate health research and medical breakthroughs, enabling individualized prevention, treatment, and care for **all of us**, including children.

**How we do it:** Robust and repeated data collection – spanning biosamples, physical measurements, electronic health records (EHRs), surveys, and wearables from a wide-range of family backgrounds – makes it possible to study the complex interplay of genetic, environmental, and social factors influencing lifelong health. The data is made available to researchers worldwide through our Researcher Workbench, with rigorous safety and data privacy measures in place.

**Why it matters:** Enrolling infants, children, and adolescents with their parents will enable researchers to leverage this vast data to study critical areas in pediatrics and better understand the origins of pediatric and adult health and disease. Discoveries may yield progress in areas such as risk factors, preventions, and therapeutic approaches during childhood and throughout the lifespan.

## Our Pediatrics Progress

**Current Enrollment Eligibility:** children can enroll from **birth to age 5**; a parent or guardian also enrolls with the child. To date, we have enrolled **1,500** pediatric participants, including **more than 1,100** in 2025!

- **Coming up:** we have IRB approval and are preparing to broaden eligibility to **ages 6 to 11**. We continue to gather feedback from key communities as we develop our plans for older children.

### Data Availability

- **Pediatric data from adult participants is available now:** As a longitudinal program with retrospective EHR collection, researchers can now access pediatric EHRs on more than **42,000** adult *All of Us* participants in the Researcher Workbench, which also includes genomic and lifestyle information up to present adult age.
- **Data from pediatric participants will be released to researchers as the cohort grows!**

### Enrollment Sites

New pediatric enrollment sites have expanded our geographic reach. The organizations enrolling children in *All of Us* are:
